Pupil Participation

Participation means that all pupils have the right to be involved in making decisions, planning and reviewing any action that might affect them.

Having a voice = Having a choice.

Article 12 of the UN Rights of the Child states "the child who is capable of forming his or her own views has the right to express those views freely in all matters affecting the child."

Pupil Participation has always been an important aspect of our school curriculum and it will continue to underpin the new curriculum.

Pupils have the opportunity to create Powerpoints, research information and present to the whole school on a variety of topics.

Our pupils are involved in suggesting areas they would like to learn more about in relation to their termly topics. These are on display in each class and reference is made to them throughout each term.

Parliament Time

Since September 2019 we have parliament time on a Friday afternoon. This is an opportunity for all pupil voice groups: School Council, Eco Council, Sport Ambassadors, Super Ambassadors, Criw Cymraeg & Digital Leaders to come together and discuss ideas and make decisions. The chairs of each parliament meets with the headteacher several times a term and they feedback to the whole school during assemblies.

Pupils are asked open questions throughout the various lessons/areas of learning and these allow them to express their opinions and debate differences of opinions in a structured manner.

Pupils have opportunities to make suggestions or share concerns within circle time activities.

Pupils are sometimes asked for their particular opinion on various issues through surveys & questionaires which the pupils either develop themselves or conduct on behalf of the school.
